# Updated Policy on Faculty Workload and Responsibilities Added to the Intranet

The updated <u>Policy on Faculty Workload and Responsibilities</u> is now accessible on the intranet, under the Faculty Workload Policy heading. Updates include expanding the range for Instructional Workload Units (IWLUs) for didactic courses (Workload Guidelines 1.C); expanding the range for IWLUs for multiple sections courses (Workload Guidelines 7.B-C); and including DNP project reader as an example function for Unfunded Service Workload Units.

### National Survey on Generational Differences in the Health Care Workforce

AMN Healthcare has released the results of a national survey on generational differences in the health care workforce, *Survey of Millennial Nurses: A Dynamic Influence on the Profession*. The report compares the views of Millennial nurses (ages 19-36) to those of Generation X (ages 37-53) and Baby Boomer nurses (ages 54-71).
